## Love: The Heart of the Christian Life

At the centre of Saint Mary Magdalene de' Pazzi's life was love—God's infinite, fiery love for humanity. Her cry, "**Love is not loved!**" echoes across the centuries, awakening us to the embrace of divine love. She envisioned the Blessed Trinity as a "council of love," creating and sustaining all things. This love, she believed, demands a response: a life lived not for self, but for God and for others.

Mary Magdalene reminds us that love of God cannot exist without love of neighbour. In her convent, she was known as the "mother of charity," caring for the elderly and infirm with joyful dedication. She challenges us today: How can we, as pilgrims of faith, reveal God's love to those in need? In her example, we are called to embrace solidarity, reaching out to others in kindness, mercy, and hope.

## Hope: Anchored in Christ

For her, the Eucharist was both nourishment for the journey and a call to gratitude and imitation of Christ.

She challenges us to approach the sacrament with renewed reverence—not as routine, but as a transformative encounter with the living God. Her example invites us to place the Eucharist at the centre of our faith journey, drawing strength from Christ to face life's waves.

## The Holy Spirit: Fire of Renewal

Mary Magdalene's prayer to the Holy Spirit captures the Spirit's role as comforter, purifier, and guide. She described the Trinity as an "ardent fire," igniting love and transforming hearts. She believed the Spirit works within us to overcome weakness and division, uniting us with God's will.

As pilgrims on the path of Carmel, we rely on the Spirit to guide us—especially when the road is unclear. Her prayer, "**Consume in us whatever prevents us from being consumed in you,**" calls us to surrender distraction and fear, so that God's Spirit may renew us in love and mission.
