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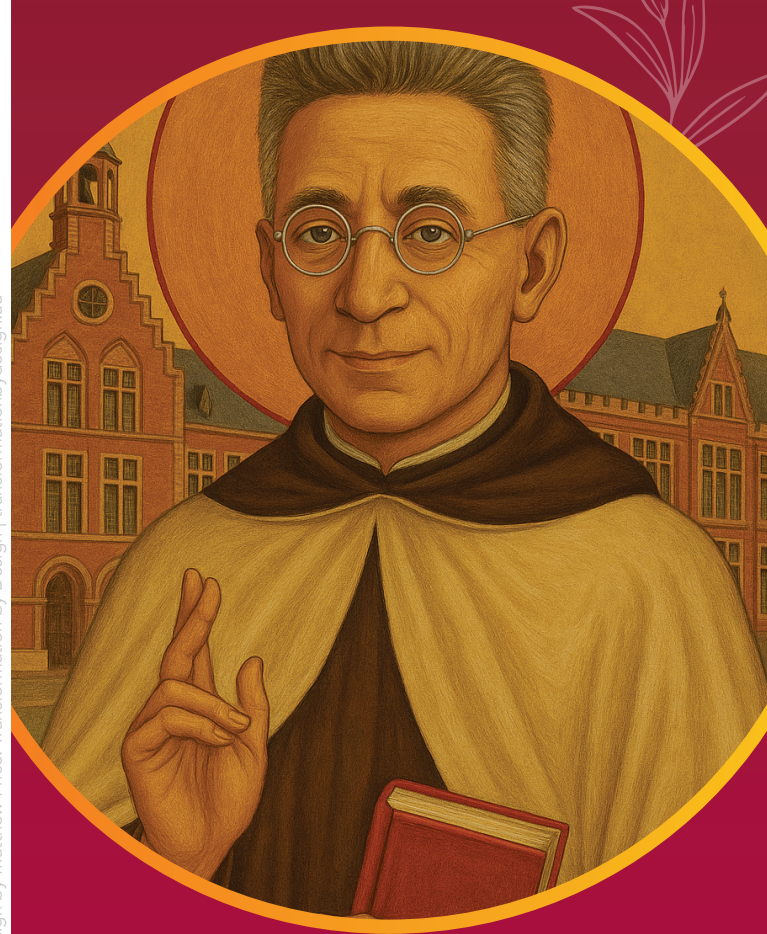

## Truth: A Person, Not an Idea

For Titus Brandsma, truth was not merely a philosophical concept but a person: Jesus Christ. As a Carmelite and philosopher, Titus understood that truth is intimately tied to our relationship with God. Jesus, who declared Himself **“the way, the truth, and the life”** (Jn 14:6), was at the heart of Titus’ life and mission. Even in his darkest moments, imprisoned by the Nazis, Titus found freedom in the truth of Christ.

In his prison cell, Titus meditated on a picture of Christ crucified, finding solace in the loving gaze of Jesus. He wrote, **“O Jesus, when I look on you, my love for you starts up anew.”** For Titus, this reciprocal gaze with Christ was a source of strength and hope. It teaches us that even in the most challenging circumstances, we can find freedom and hope in the truth of Christ.

## Truth and Human Dignity

Titus believed that truth is inseparable from the dignity of every human person. Made in the image of God, each of us carries an inherent worth that cannot be diminished by external circumstances. This belief guided Titus in his work as an educator, journalist, and Carmelite. He recognized the uniqueness of every individual, respecting their differences and encouraging them to think for themselves.

Titus taught that truth must be communicated in a way that uplifts and affirms human dignity. As a journalist, he understood the power of words and images, using them to educate and inspire rather than degrade. His commitment to truth led him to confront the lies and propaganda of the Nazi regime, knowing that speaking the truth often comes with a cost. Titus reminds us that our pursuit of truth must always uphold the dignity of others, even in the face of opposition.

## Truth and Creation

For Titus, truth extended beyond humanity to encompass all of creation. He viewed the world as God’s handiwork, a reflection of divine truth and beauty. This perspective inspired him to see creation as a gift to be respected and cared for. Titus found in Mary, the Mother of Carmel, a model for contemplating God’s presence in creation. He wrote, **“May she lead us...to the contemplation of God in all He has created.”**

## Truth in Love: An Apostolate of Hope

Titus lived what St. Paul described as **“speaking the truth in love”** (Eph 4:15). His life was a testament to the power of truth infused with love. Whether in his family, his Carmelite community, or his work with students and journalists, Titus embodied the unity of truth and love. He believed that truth should never divide but rather bring people together in understanding and mutual respect.

In a world often fractured by division, Titus’ example is a powerful reminder of the importance of truth as a unifying force. He invites us to engage in an **“apostolate of truth in love,”** fostering dialogue, building bridges, and seeking the common good.

Titus’ life shows us that truth is not static but dynamic, reaching out to humanity and offering hope.
